

Stonehenge at Sunset and Starlight at Beltane

Booking procedure ...

Stonehenge tour places can only be booked by subscribers to my site. The fee for subscription is £15.00 and this has already been deducted from the tour fee (£190.00), so you are now paying the adjusted rate. This amended tour fee is now £175.00 per person; this fee is for the 14 hour lecture tour, a pub lunch and evening meal, and 2 special access visits inside the inner circle of Stonehenge; the first at Sunset and the second, by Starlight on the same evening. If you are booking more than one place, the discounted fee of £175.00 also applies to each person.

Having decided you wish to book, you first need to obtain a Henge Tour booking reference from David Rowan. You can do this by writing to him at Stonehenge@davidrowan.co.uk, or, by phoning 07919 555 275 duri99ng office hours, Monday to Friday only.

Once you have obtained your unique Henge Tour booking reference ...

To book, click on the booking link at the bottom of the Henge tour page:

When you subscribe, make a note of your login details – you will be asked to enter them when you book

Once subscribed, you can then go ahead and book your allocated place/s using your unique Henge Tour booking reference, given to you by David.

Please note:

Places are not transferable and payments are not refundable

The procedure may seem a little complex, but it is designed to ensure that only those with permission are able to come along. Places on the tours are strictly limited by English Heritage.
